6 for 10 at Wildewood

This is a six month strategy to reach 10 families. Wildewood has a wall to break through to become effective in this community and we are starting today. Over the next 6 months from November through April we are going to launch a focused effort of prayer and activity to reach 10 new families in our community to become active participants in our family at Wildewood.

We must meet new families and touch them with the love of Jesus. Like the farmer who sowed seed that Christ told us about we need to cast much seed to see a great harvest. The following is an outline of that new strategy.

- ~~October 25th: The church will be challenged to reach 10 new non-churched families in the next 6 months with prayer and commitment of time through the proposed activities. We will begin passing out Team Impact cards and posters.~~
- ~~November 1st: Pass out "Join the Team" cards and begin prayer for Team impact. Each person in our church will be challenged to write down 3 names of non-churched people that they will invite to the event.~~
- ~~November 15th: Team Impact will be here Sunday morning and Sunday evening at 6pm. The church will be challenged to show up at 5pm to pray.~~
- December 5th: Church progressive dinner. The church will be encouraged to bring a non-churched friend or neighbor to this very benign fellowship atmosphere.
- December 6th: The adult Christmas program. Great time to bring a family member to hear the gospel presented in song.
- December 13th: Children's Christmas Sunday. The preschool families will be in service and we will need to make every effort to make them feel welcome and let them know that we desire them to be apart of our family.
- December 24th: Your Family Christmas Eve Service. A family atmosphere of traditional songs and the Christmas story being read to the children on the stage ending in candlelight.
- January 3rd: Launch the "What is your story" page on the website.
- January 10th: Launch of "Be the story". Introduce the theme for the year and begin the 40 day plan of listening through the Bible. During these 40 days we will take a missions offering to help translate the Bible into new languages. The goal will be 2000.00 which will provide 2 New Testament books to be translated into a new language that does not have a Bible.
- January 30th: Send out mailer to local communities about the wedding feast.
- February 6th and 13th: Church wide door invitation campaign about the wedding feast. The church will be challenged place 2000 invitations on the doors of the local community.
- February 14th: Wedding Feast: As a part of the "Be the Story" campaign we will be having monthly fellowships that center around the stories in the Bible preached that week. On this Sunday the story will be told about the parable of the wedding feast and we will put on a wedding feast. We will give away a special valentine prize.
- February 20th or 27th: Church wide service outreach project.
- March 2nd – 21st: Rodeo for Outreach. We will do the rodeo fund raiser to raise money for three outreach events in 2010. The goal will be 6500, or 8 nights of at least 10 volunteers.
- March 28th: Palm Sunday challenge to reach lost people with an invitation to be apart of His Story.
- April 4th: Easter. Become apart of His story!

I'm adjusting to living alone and losing a close friend here. But Dad has provided two new guys to come live with me in January! He always provides what we need!



A Word from Blake Thomas

11/25/09

Hello dear friends,

I received news last night that my grandfather passed away. He lived a long, full life and was a great man. I thought before I came overseas that I could lose a grandparent while I was overseas, but I was hoping it wouldn't happen. This is the first person I've been close to that has passed away. It's difficult for me to process all of the feelings and emotions, especially being so far away from my parents.

This morning was very rough. I think on Tuesday night, I was still in shock and not really processing everything. But I woke up early in the morning and couldn't go back to sleep. I was hoping to be able to return to the funeral, but it's not going to work out. I cannot leave my country right now because my Visa is being processed. It expires on November 30, so right now we are in the process of getting it renewed, and my passport isn't even in my possession. It's at the immigration office right now. So I'm not sure when I'll get it back.

This morning I was processing everything, and I think the hardest part was realizing I couldn't go back. It was a rough morning. I thought about all the things I've been through since I've been here, my motorcycle accident, my surgery and long recovery, all the difficulties caused by my roommate leaving suddenly and trying to understand everything involved with that, and now my grandfather passing away. I can see many ways Dad has grown me through all of these trials. But this morning I was seriously considering giving up and going back to America. All of these things combined have become more than I can bear. But that's where the good news comes in. These things are more than I can bear alone, but thankfully Dad understands and has been my comfort in all of these things. I've seen him provide in some of the most difficult times in my life, and because of that, I know that He will provide all that I need and that my family needs right now. I truly believe that the past 6-7 months have been the most difficult time in my entire life.

Thanksgiving might be difficult for me. Every year when I was growing up, we would go to visit my grandfather, so most of my Thanksgiving memories involve being at his house and spending time with him. Tomorrow I'll celebrate with my team and my "family" in the city, and I know they'll be a great support for me. Today one of my supervisors took me to lunch, and another team member covered my shift at the Center, and then my neighbors cooked me dinner. I am so thankful for their support, encouragement, and prayers.

Now I'm trying to learn about death in this culture, and how funerals and burials usually occur. I'm hoping to have many opportunities to share about JC, and about how I have peace because I know my grandpa is with JC right now!

I'm looking to Paul as an example. He endured such great suffering, yet despite all he went through, he kept the good news at the center of all he did. So no matter what happens, I am prying that Dad would help me do the same. I trust that He will use all these things to grow me and give me a deeper understanding of Him, and also to give testimony to His amazing power, faithfulness, and comforting hand. I have truly been able to see that Dad works all things together for His glory played out in my life over here. And I take great comfort in that truth.

Thank you so much for your prys and support. Each of you has played a special role in my life, and I will definitely be remembering you tomorrow on Thanksgiving before our incredible Father!

WBC Treasurer's Report—October 2009

Contributions and Reserve:

- In October contributions to Wildewood totaled \$14,095, 28% below budget, only 82% of September gifts and 3% less than October 2008 donations. October is only the second month in 2009 that gifts did not exceed those in the same month of 2008.
- The unrestricted reserve at the close of business on 31 October was \$5,383. Wildewood's total reserve at the end of October was \$14,880.

Expenditures:

- Total expenditures in October were \$17,795, \$3,700 more than contributions. That was \$1,767 under budget, (9%), and 2% less than September expenditures. Expenses were 9% lower when compared October spending last year.
- The Fellowship ministry was 80% under budget. The October fellowship event, the International Festival, received some directed contributions and approximately \$100 in cost for the event has not been paid. Together these elements combined to make the Fellowship come in well under budget. Fellowship events in November and December, along with the payment of amounts still outstanding for the International Festival will bring the fellowship spending near the budget amount for the year.
- Youth ministry was under budget by \$395, (73%), for the month. It is expected that this important ministry will be significantly under budget through year's end as it is reorganized.
- Children's ministry was under budget by \$452, (77%), for the month. Designated gifts for the Fall Festival and some outstanding bills are the primary reason for this underage. The holiday period is a relatively expensive period for this ministry and it is expected to be near its annual budget by year's end.
- Church Administration: was 72% under budget for the month. This aberration is primarily a mater of timing. At years end it will be at the budget amount.
- All other major budget categories were within the established acceptable variance.

Other:

- Outlook: The overall financial position of Wildewood declined slightly in October. We need strong November and December contributions to finish the year in a financial condition that will allow us to aggressively plan for 2010. Your faithful support of Wildewood is what has made us able to be an effective force for our Lord in the Spring Klein area for over a quarter century. Your continued support, the growing support of other members, and the additional gifts you may be able and lead in making, will allow Wildewood to be an even greater servant for many more years.

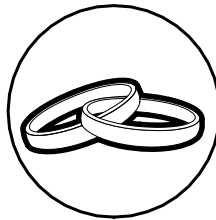
we will work to fulfill the Great Commission!

Come and renew your commitment to your spouse and put a spark back into your relationship. Nothing says "I love you" like "I still do!"

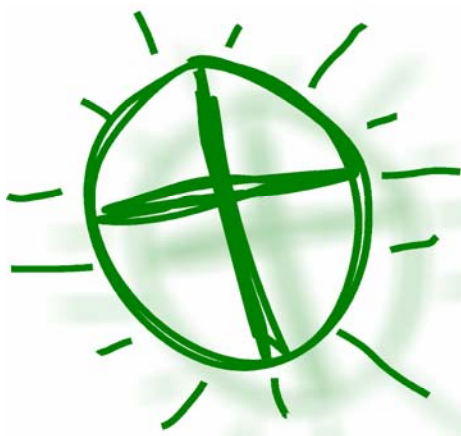

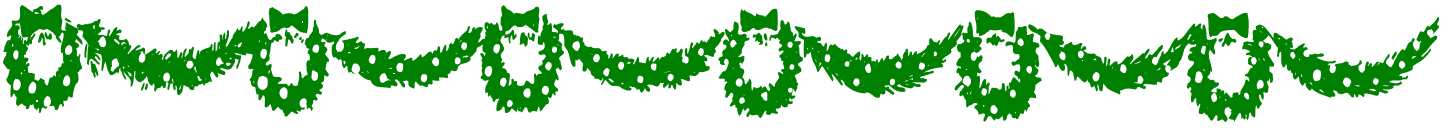

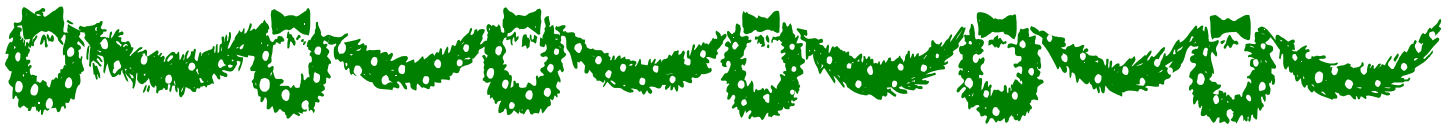
A Song is Born—Christmas Musical Celebration— Sunday, December 6
